New Policy on Early Trip Sign-Up

Announcing a new benefit for WSC members

At the January 2022 meeting of the Wilmington Ski Club Council, the members unanimously approved a modification of the Ski Trip sign-up procedure. This update was done to provide another benefit to being a Continuous Member of the Club.

Continuous members will have exclusive rights to sign-up for trips during the first two (2) weeks of the trip sign-up period. This is another benefit of remaining as an active, paid member of the club.

The new procedure provides new definitions of membership:

Continuous Members are those members who have held paid memberships for at least the two (2) most recent consecutive WSC membership years prior to the club year in which a trip is scheduled.

Current Members are members who do not qualify as continuous members, i.e. most likely by not having been a paid member for at least two years.

The revised procedures are available on our website at: <u>Guideline for Trip and Activity Sign-Ups 2022-01</u>. The revised section of the policy is below.

1. Timeline/Qualifications for Wilmington Ski Club ("WSC") Trip Sign-ups

Definitions:

- "CONTINUOUS Members": Members who have held paid memberships for at least the two (2) most recent consecutive WSC membership years prior to the WSC year in which the trip is scheduled. By way of example, for a trip scheduled for January 2024, members must have been in good standing (i.e., dues paid) for the WSC membership years that commenced on July 1, 2021 and July 1, 2022, and must pay dues for the WSC membership year that commences on July 1, 2023 in order to sign up for the trip.
- "CURRENT and NEW Members": Members who do not qualify as CONTINUOUS Members and members who join only for the WSC year during which the trip is scheduled. By way of example, for a trip scheduled for January 2024, members must pay dues for the WSC membership year that commences on July 1, 2023, in order to sign up for the trip.

Trip Sign-up Period:

The trip sign-up period will consist of early sign-up for 4 weeks and then regular sign-up continuing until the trip is filled or otherwise closed, as follows:

- First 2 weeks: All WSC CONTINUOUS members.
- Second 2 weeks: Open to above; and WSC CURRENT and NEW members. NOTE: This includes any Eastern Pennsylvania Ski Council affiliated club ("EPSC") members who join the Wilmington Ski Club and pay the annual membership dues for the WSC year during which the trip is scheduled.
- Weeks 5 and Forward: Open to above; and any member in good standing with any EPSC ski club. Trip sign-ups will continue at both the September and October general meetings.

Trip Leaders may adjust the period of sign-up, including initial sign-up deposit if the Trip Contract requires earlier and/or higher deposits by the tour operator, hotel and/or the airline. Council approval is required, and Trip Leaders are required to provide ample notice (via website, Blast, Scrapings and Trip Flyers) prior to the initial signup date.



Big Sky Trip Report

WSC and the Biggest Skiing America 2022

We had 42 slots available for our trip to Big Sky Montana, March 12-19, 2022.

Our trip had a rocky start. The night before our journey one of our skiers got ill and could not travel. We hoped that he would join us in a day or so, but that was not the case.

Our adventure began with a 5 AM American Airlines flight from Philadelphia to Charlotte, NC and then on to Bozeman, MT. Unfortunately, American Airlines counters and kiosks only open at 3:30 AM and we weren't the only ones with a 5 AM flight!

What we didn't know was there's a rule that luggage and the traveler must be checked in no later than 45 minutes prior to flight time (4:15 AM for our group). Due to a mistake by an AA agent moving some of our group to another flight time because of this rule, upon trying to board the plane, we discovered the tickets for our entire group had been canceled because we're all on the same record locator! After some investigation and negotiation with AA supervisors we were all rebooked on a later flight to Charlotte (AA was holding the plane for us, supposedly this does not happen very often) and fortunately we were still able to make the only connection to Bozeman. Whew!!!

Once in Bozeman, we quickly boarded our charter bus and had a smooth ride to Big Sky's Huntley Lodge through the incredible scenery of southeastern Montana. We had a 30 minute stop at Albertson's for some grocery and beverage shopping. Upon arrival, the hotel porters (a.k.a. "cowboys") unloaded our luggage and quickly delivered it to our rooms and our week began.

Each day began with an extensive & delicious buffet breakfast at the Huntley. There were a few snowy days where we were able to shush through some light powdery snow and some bright beautiful sunny "bluebird" days too! Unfortunately, it was school break for Montana students, a big junior race was taking place and skiers came

from other parts of the Rockies which had little snow, so this made the lift lines a bit longer at times and resulted in some crowding at lunch. But on the mountain, there was plenty of room and it wasn't unusual to feel like you had trails to yourself.

Some adventurous skiers took the tram (one trip included for those with group lift tickets & separate payment for those with Ikon) to the top of Lone Peak Mountain to explore the bowls and black diamond runs. Tram prices varied daily between \$80 to \$100. Tree skiing was also popular. One afternoon we had a new adventure when there was thunder and lightning while it snowed which closed all the lifts, stranding skiers for 30 minutes.

As in many places, Covid limited public bus service and closed a couple of restaurants in the village. 
